California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)


Purpose of CEQA:

- Inform governmental decision makers and the public
- Identify ways environmental impacts can reduced or avoided
- Prevent significant environmental impacts by requiring changes, alternatives, or mitigation measures
- Disclose to the public why a project was approved if the project involves significant impacts



Purpose of Scoping Meeting


- Inform the public of the proposed project.
- Disclose the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and the potential impacts being reviewed
- Solicit guidance from the public and agencies on environmental issues via comments on the Notice of Preparation
- Public Comment Period 30 Days
 - March 7 to April 10, 2017






Sunnyvale Plans Referring to the Project

Project Description

Five Proposed Options

- 1. Four auto travel lanes plus protected bike facilities and sidewalks
- 2. Two auto travel lanes plus protected bike facilities and sidewalks
- 3. Pedestrian / bicycle crossing with facilities for shuttles/buses
- 4. Pedestrian / bicycle crossing (no automobiles)
- 5. Removal from the General Plan (no project)





Project Overview

- At this stage, there is no preferred project option
- This project will fully environmentally review five options
- City Council will then select the preferred option
- Detailed design would occur as a separate, later project (if Council does not select "Remove Project from General Plan")




1. Four Lane Mary Avenue Option









2. Two Lane Mary Avenue









3. Pedestrian/Bike/Transit Bridge








4. Pedestrian/Bike Bridge

Sunnyvale Travel Demand Model


- Regional 9-county model calibrated to Sunnyvale
- LUTE includes roadway changes from Valley
 Transportation Plan and Sunnyvale Transportation Impact

 Overcrossing EIR will also include new bike lanes along Mary Avenue (south)
