




Mary Avenue Overcrossing Environmental Impact Report Project Location




Sunnyvale Plans Referring to the Project

- General Plan 1972, 2011
- Land Use and Transportation Element 1981, 1997, 2017
- Specific Plans 2004, 2013, 2016
- Traffic Impact Fee 2005



History and Community Concerns

- 2007 Mary Avenue Extension Draft EIR
 - 4-lane configuration
- Community concerns included:
 - Mary Avenue traffic volumes
 - Pedestrian and bicycle safety on Mary Ave
 - Noise, air quality and property values
 - Encouraging use of light rail transit (LRT)
 - Ped/bike access to LRT station and Ross Dr
 - Business impacts during construction
- 2008 Final EIR and Project Study Report
- 2009 Legal Action on EIR
- New project is designed to address prior concerns



August 2007

- AB 1338 Complete Streets Act 2007
- SB 375 Sustainable Communities Act 2008
- AB 1193 Protected Bikeways Act 2013
- SB 743 Environmental Review 2013



Traffic Concerns






Project Overview

• At this stage, there is no preferred project option

• This project will fully environmentally review four options

- City Council will then select the preferred option
- Detailed design would occur as a separate, later project (if Council does not select "Remove Project from General Plan")







Four Proposed Options

- 1. Four auto travel lanes plus bike lanes and sidewalks
- 2. Two auto travel lanes plus enhanced bike lanes and sidewalks


3a. Pedestrian / bicycle crossing (no automobiles)3b. Pedestrian / bicycle crossing with facilities for shuttles/buses

4. Removal from the General Plan (no project)






1. Four Lane Mary Avenue Option








2. Two Lane Mary Avenue








3a. Pedestrian/Bike Bridge

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

- 1970 State of California environmental law
- Purpose of CEQA:
 - Inform governmental decision makers and the public
 - Identify ways environmental impacts can be reduced or avoided
 - Prevent significant environmental impacts by requiring changes, alternatives, or mitigation measures
 - Disclose to the public why a project was approved if the project involves significant impacts



Intent of the Mary Avenue Project EIR

The EIR Will:

The EIR Will Not:


- Review environmental impacts of all four overcrossing options
- Consider concepts and impacts associated with the four overcrossing options
- Examine bike facilities as part of Options 1 – 3
- Consider traffic impacts including trips from future foreseeable developments

- Select and conduct detailed design of the preferred overcrossing option
- Consider options that turn Mary into an expressway or freeway on/off ramp
- Re-evaluate Mary Avenue bike lanes project (south of Maude)
- Reconsider permitting for developments in the area (covered in GP, LUTE, and individual entitlement process)

Project Timeline


