The purpose of this meeting was to introduce the project, present existing conditions, and receive input from attendees. A formal presentation was followed by a polling exercise for community members to vote on preferred park uses and features. Attendees also had the opportunity to ask questions and share comments during the meeting. Results from the polling exercise and additional comments received are noted below.

Polling Exercise Summary

Community members expressed a strong preference for a park that supports primarily passive uses. An open turf area, a playground, and a pollinator garden were highly preferred park features. A majority of attendees did not feel splash play, a restroom, sports courts, and WiFi were important amenities to provide at this park. In general, community members envision the park to be a clean, safe, green, and relaxing space they can take their dogs to. (For detailed polling results, see attached.)

Additional comments received

Primary comments and concerns expressed by attendees included preference for a small dog park and concerns regarding safety, privacy, access, and parking.

<u>Dog Park</u>

- Many community members in the neighborhood have dogs. Consider a small dog play area located near the soundwall to mitigate noise concerns.
- If no dog park is provided, will dogs be allowed in the park?
 - Dogs are typically allowed on-leash at all public parks.

Safety, Privacy, Access, and Parking

- Will there be fencing around the park?
 - The existing perimeter fence is temporary and will be removed when the park opens. If there is a play area, fencing will likely be provided around the play area.
- Will the park provide parking?
 - It was noted there is on-street parking available along Lily Avenue and Toyon Avenue. If it is determined that additional off-street parking is needed, it should be noted that it would come at the expense of park space.
- Are the existing parking spaces for the HOA use or public park use?
 - Private streets in the HOA area include Public Access Easements and the street parking spaces are identified as "Guest Parking."
- Can gated-access be provided where the park is adjacent to residences?
 - There aren't currently plans to fence or gate off any side of the park as this is a public park.
- Existing narrow, private streets (Vinemaple Terrace and Valonia Oaks Terrace) may become through-streets for park visitors and become less safe for kids at play
- Increased foot traffic on narrow, private streets may impact residents' privacy
- Encourage people to walk to the park as there may be a parking issue if many people drive to the park
- A parking lot may not be necessary if the park doesn't provide large-scale athletic amenities.
- Consider trees or hedges as a visual screen between the park and homes directly adjacent to it

Additional Comments

- Can a historical plaque acknowledging the history of Corn Palace be provided?
 A plaque has been fabricated and will be installed in the park.
- The Harmony Community currently maintains the area between the sidewalk and the street on 3 sides of the park. Should this responsibility be handed off to the City?
 - Formal requests should be made to the City's property administration.
- This site has been a location for illegal fireworks in the past. Can security be provided here on July 4th?
 - Requests should be made to the City's Public Safety Services department.

The information above is Callander Associates' understanding of items discussed at the meeting. Callander Associates is proceeding with the project based on this understanding.








